## NYFC VIDEO RECORDING GUIDELINES FOR YOUNG MUSICIANS CONTEST 2021\*

Requirements: Competitors must submit video entries for the Young Musicians Contest.

- 1) All videos must be recorded unaccompanied, even if your music typically requires an accompaniment. We make this requirement for the sake of fairness; different regions of the USA and the world will relax and restrict their social distancing guidelines at different times, making impossible a fair opportunity for piano rehearsal.
- 2) To preserve an important characteristic of a conventional live contest experience, repertoire for any round of submission <u>must be recorded in one consecutive take</u>. Competitors should state their name and piece selections at the beginning of the video before performing.
- 3) You may record your videos using any smartphone, tablet, or other device you already own. Here are some guidelines to help you make a great home recording:
  - a) Place your camera or device on a tripod or flat surface while recording.
  - b) Have more light sourced in front of you than behind you.
  - c) Film at a medium distance, capturing as much detail as possible while making certain that you are always entirely visible.
  - d) Wherever you record, do so in a clean and visually professional location (tidy space, quiet background).
  - e) Please dress as you would for a live contest.
- 5) Recordings should be uploaded to YouTube. Instructions for uploading a YouTube video can be found here.\*\* It is recommended that applicants upload an <u>unlisted</u>\*\*\* YouTube video.
