

Samuel Baron was born in Brooklyn on April 27, 1925. After graduating from Juilliard, where he studied with Georges Barrère and Arthur Lora, he went on to found the New York Brass Ensemble and New York Woodwind Quintet. After leaving the quintet, Baron played with the New York City Opera Orchestra and served as principal flute of the Minneapolis Symphony during its 1952–53 season. Other highlights of his career include directing the Bach Aria Festival and Institute and teaching at Stony Brook, Yale, and Mannes. He also served as chair of Juilliard's woodwind department. He is the recipient of the National Service Award from Chamber Music America and the Lifetime Achievement Award from the National Flute Association.
